CHAPTER 281.

Passed Mar. 9, 1835. *A supplement to an act, entitled, an act to Incorporate the Delaware and Maryland Rail Road Company.*

Books to be opened Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the commissioners, appointed by the act to which this is a supplement, or any three of them, shall cause books to be opened at such times and places as they may direct, in each of which books they shall enter as follows:—

Form of entries We, whose names are herewith subscribed, do promise to pay to the President and Directors of the Delaware and Maryland Rail Road Company, the sum of fifty dollars, for every share of stock set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such times as shall be determined by the President and Directors of the said Company—witness our hands, this day of _____, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty _____; and shall thereupon

Notice give notice in one or more newspapers printed in Elkton, Wilmington, and such other place or places as they may think proper, of the time and places, when and where the said books shall be opened to receive subscriptions to the stock of the said Company; at which respective times and places, two or more of the said commissioners shall attend and permit all persons of lawful age, who shall offer to subscribe in the said books in their own name, or in the name of any other person who shall authorise the same, for any number of shares in the said stock; and the said books shall be kept open at least six hours in every judicial day, for the space of six days, or until there shall have been subscribed eight thousand shares; and if, at the expiration of six days, the books aforesaid shall not have the number of shares aforesaid therein subscribed, the said commissioners may adjourn from time to time, and transfer the book or books elsewhere, until the said eight thousand shares shall be subscribed; of which adjournment and transfer, the commissioners aforesaid, or any three of them, shall give such notice as the occasion may require; and when the whole number of shares shall be subscribed, then the books shall be closed; but no subscription shall be valid

Receive subscriptions, &c. unless the person so subscribing, shall pay to the said commissioners, at the time of making the same, the sum of five dollars on each share, for the use of the company.
