CHAPTER 304.

An act relating to the Public Roads, in Talbot County. Paned Mar.20, 1835

> WHEREAS, the present mode of keeping in order the public roads in Talbot county, is found by experience to be im-

perfect, Therefore:

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners for Talbot county, or a majority of them, be, and they are hereby authorised and required to meet together on the first Monday of April, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty five, and on the same day in every year thereafter, at the court house, in said county, and when so met together, the said commissioners or a majority of them. shall be and they are hereby authorised (if not already done to their satisfaction) to describe, ascertain and distinctly record, in a well bound book, to be provided if necessary, for that purpose, the several respective roads and public

highways in said county, and to nominate and appoint capable and judicious persons as supervisors of the several and respective roads aforesaid, according to the number and
