CHAPTER 319.

Passed Mar. 21, 1835 *An act for the relief of Artemus W. Maynard, James Harrison and Gassaway Watkins.*

Benefit of insolvent
acts

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of insolvent debtors for the city and county of Baltimore, and the judges of Baltimore county court, respectively, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant to Artemus W. Maynard, James Harris and Gassaway Watkins, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly passed for the relief of insolvent debtors, provided, that the said Artemus W. Maynard, James Harris, and Gassaway Watkins, shall in all respects except that of proving residence comply with the requisitions of said acts of Assembly, and that they satisfy the said commissioners that they did not come into this State, with a view of obtaining the benefit of said insolvent laws aforesaid: Provided, also that the said Artemus W. Maynard, James Harris, and Gassaway Watkins, shall be compelled to file their petitions for the benefit of said insolvent laws, previous to their discharge from custody.

CHAPTER 320.

Passed Mar. 21, 1835 *An act for the revaluation and reassessment of the Real Property of St. Mary's County.*

Appoint assessors,
&c.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Levy court of Saint Mary's county shall on or before the first Monday of May next, appoint in each election district in said county, three discreet and sensible persons as commissioners residents of the districts, whose business it shall be to value and assess all the real property of Saint Mary's county, in their respective districts subject to taxation, a majority of whom shall be competent to act, and in the event of the death, removal, or disqualification of all or either of them, the levy court is hereby authorised and required to supply forthwith such vacancy or vacancies.*

Oath—cert.icate

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted, That before proceeding to act, each of the said commissioners shall make oath or affirmation as the case may be, before some justice of the peace of*
