Resolution authorising the Librarian to receive Congressional Documents due the State. Passed Mar. 4, 1836

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That David Ridgely, the State Librarian, be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to receive and receipt for the Congressional Documents due to the State, by the act of Congress, passed at the first session of the twenty second Congress, and approved July the tenth, eighteen hundred and thirty two, together with any other public documents heretofore presented by acts of Congress, and not received.*

Resolution in favor of Polly Stephens. Passed Mar. 11,

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Polly Stephens, widow of Levi Stephens, a soldier of the revolution, the half pay of a private during her life, in quarterly payments.*

Resolution in favor of Joseph Willey.

WHEREAS, by resolution number twenty four, passed at Passed Mar. 11, December session, eighteen hundred and thirty three, captain Joseph Branson was authorised to take possession of six pieces of Artillery, belonging to the State, and cause the same to be repaired; and whereas, Captain Branson resigned his commission before he had carried into effect the provisions of said resolution;—Therefore,
