Resolutions in relation to certain duties of the Treasurer. Passed Feb. 27, 1835

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to draw for, and apply, in satisfaction of so much of the authorised demands upon the Treasury during the current fiscal year, the sum of forty four thousand and fourteen dollars and seventy eight cents, of the State's special deposits, now in the Union Bank of Maryland, at such times, and in such sums, as shall, in his judgment, be required by the public convenience and interest.

Resolved, That the said Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to sell and dispose of the debt due to the State by the Bank of Maryland, on account of special deposits therein, as soon as conveniently he can do so, for the best price he can obtain for the same; and for this purpose he is hereby empowered to employ an agent in Baltimore, or elsewhere, and to allow him a reasonable compensation for his services; and the said sale may be made for cash, or on time, as shall appear to said Treasurer most conducive to the interest of the State; *Provided,* the payment of the said sale, should be made on time, shall be well secured.

Resolved, That the money arising from said sale, be and the same is hereby appropriated, when received, towards the discharge of the authorised demands upon the treasury during the current fiscal year.

Resolution relative to the Tobacco Inspection Revenue. Passed Feb. 27, 1835

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to place the balance of the tobacco inspection revenue that remained in the treasury on the first day of December last, and any further balance thereof which shall be in the treasury on the first of December, annually, to the credit of the sinking fund, until the portion of the said fund, which is directed to the redemption of the debt of
