Resolution relative to the repairs of the Government House, &c. Passed Mar. 13, 1835

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Governor and Council be, and they are hereby authorised and directed to have such repairs as they deem requisite, made to the government house, and suitable necessary new enclosures about the grounds attached thereto; and that they draw on the Treasurer for such sum or sums as may be necessary therefor, who is hereby directed to pay such draughts out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, not exceeding two thousand dollars.

Resolution in favor of Charles Smith. Passed Mar. 7

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Charles Smith, of Talbot county, in quarterly payments during his life, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the half pay of a private, in consideration of his services in the war of the revolution.
