not to exceed fixe hundred acres of land; AND WHEREAS CHAP. 59. said trustees have represented to this General Assembly, that they have made an advantageous and cheap purchase of a farm containing seven hundred and twenty-two acres of land, and pray that their act may be confirmed: There-

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Ma-Purchase confirmryland, That the purchase of the farm for the use of the poor of Dorchester county, made by the trustees of the poor, and containing seven hundred and twenty two acres, be and the same is hereby confirmed and made as valid and effectual, as if the same had contained but five hundred acres of land, as was required by the original act, to which

this is a supplement. Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the present trustees of Loan authorised the poor for Dorchester county, shall be and they are hereby authorised to contract for, and negotiate a loan upon the credit of said county, for any sum of money not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars, for the use and benefit of the new

poors institution in said county.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That to secure the punctual Payment provided payment of said loan as the same shall become due, the trustees aforesaid shall be and they are hereby authorised and required, to set apart the amount now due, for the sale of the old poor house farm, and the surplus production of the new farm, as a fund, to be used for the purpose of paying said loan, and no other.

CHAPTER 59.

An act authorising the Levy Court of Frederick County, in Ressed Feb. 11, 1835 their discretion, to levy a sum of money, to defray the funeral expenses of Edward O'Brien, a Revolutionary soldier.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, that Levy authorised the Levy court of Frederick county, be in their discretion authorised to levy and pay to Jacob Boller, thirty dollars, the amount stated to be paid by him as funeral expenses of Edward O'Brien, a revolutionary soldier.
