CHAPTER 77.

Passed Feb. 12, 1835 *A supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the re assessment and re-valuation of all the real and personal property in Allegany County.*

Authority in case
of appeal

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the passage of this act, the commissioners of Allegany county, are hereby authorised, in their discretion, at their next meeting, at the suggestion of any individual, to reconsider and examine the valuation and assessment of any real and personal property, valued under the act to which this is a supplement; and if, upon a full hearing and examination, said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall be of opinion that any valuation of real and personal property has been too high, or too low, to make such alteration in the valuation of the same, as shall appear just and right.

Assessment

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the commissioners shall, at their first levy after the valuation made by them under this act, proceed to levy the taxation on the said new valuation made by them, as the circumstances of the county may require.

CHAPTER 78.

Passed Feb. 16, 1835 *An act for the benefit of Samuel J. Delissa, of the City of Baltimore.*

Insolvent

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Insolvent Debtors, for the city and county of Baltimore, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant to Samuel J. Delissa, of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly for the relief of insolvent debtors; *Provided,* that the said Samuel J. Delissa shall, in all respects, (except that of proving residence,) comply with the requisitions of said acts of assembly, and that he satisfy said commissioners that he did not come into this State with the view of obtaining the benefit of said insolvent laws.
