CHAPTER 80.

Passed Feb. 10, 1835 *A further additional supplement to an act, entitled an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the Estates of Purchasers.*

Deed confirmed

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all deeds or instruments of writing, which have been taken executed and acknowledged, within this State, since the first day of September eighteen hundred and thirty-two, which may not have been certified by the takers of the acknowledgments of said deeds or instruments of writing, as required by the act of December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-one, chapter two hundred and five, be and the same are hereby confirmed and made valid, to all intents and purposes; Provided, that in all other respects the said deeds or instruments of writing have been executed, acknowledged and recorded in conformity with the laws relating to the subject at that time in force in this State.

CHAPTER 81.

Passed Jan. 8, 1835 *An act for the relief of Thomas B. Waterman.*

Insolvent

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of insolvent debtors, for the city and county of Baltimore, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered, to grant to Thomas B. Waterman, of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly passed for the relief of Insolvent debtors, Provided, the said Thomas B. Waterman shall in all respects, (except that of proving residence,) comply with the requisitions of said acts of assembly, and that he satisfy the said commissioners, that he did not come into this State with the view of obtaining the benefit of the said Insolvent laws.
