John Cope told him this Depoant that Mr. William and Samuel Cope did have by Right when they were born by Maj. Sir... Whately and Genl. Wm. and Capt. Samuel Wilson to where a Cedar Post had stood on the same Side where there is now a Pipe - Post now and this Depoant saith he made known and said he believed they did have Right for this - Depoant saith he and Capt. William Holland did see some Pine trees from where it was said the Cedar post - stood and the said John Cope told him this Depoant the Line of Marked trees went Quite up the Hill and said there was an Oak the P. Pine that Robert Bayes made a Cabin on the same Bank Cut down and mark it in pine wood and this Depoant saith he asked the said Cope what went with Cedar Post and he said that Robert Bayes pulled it up and threw it in the Bay and when this Depoant asked the said Cope what the Cedar - Post was used therefor he said that his Master told him that it was set down where a Boundary of Whites - Land stood that was dead and this Depoant further saith not —

Standing near the same Side on the Mouth of a small Dene near to a small Pine Tree which is a small Distance Eastly - from the White fence which is partly made with White Cut of timber commonly called and known by the Name of the Water Wall and Capt. William Holland told this Depoant it was about Between W. White and Holland and further this Depoant declareth that further Down the same or Bay Side on the land of the high Land near to where there is now a Pine Postman tree he saw a Cedar Post Marked with sixteen Notches and saith he was told by - Capt. Evans and John Millman that it was a boundary between the Point Land and Michael Cope Land and this Depoant further saith not —
