Nicholas Dodine that the Best of his knowledge that a Road Oak was a Division Boundary between
him the said Ahab Coton and Thomas Cullif and that he the said Ahab Coton told the said Nicholas
Dodine that they Run to a Hopyng Gum with a small Road Oak growing out from the Root standing
to the North side of the Gum thence along to an Olde Path where there was a Great Pine standing
