18th Mat: Cannon Command was Given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should let William W: Baly of Somerset County Stand if he should be found in his County and him should keep safe that he might have his Oath before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Brimston on the third Sunday of June Come Down into thousand seven hundred and Eighty One to Answer unto Mathew Cannon of Exeter of his charge upon the Case &c And the same day is Given to the said Mathew Cannon

At which day here came the said Mathew Cannon by Josiah Bell his Attorney and the Sheriff with John Dennis Gent now here. Proved that he had taken the said W: Baly's Oath here at this day he had ready to Answer the said Mathew Cannon of the said Exeter

Whereupon the said William Baly at the prayer of the said Mathew Cannon is Adjourned to Give special Bail to the Mathew Cannon certain Conditions the Sheriff of Somerset County planters his Consent herein Court in his proper Person under seal of the said W: Baly that he should keep that Judgment in the plea of the said Mathew Cannon Against the said W: Baly that he the said W: Baly should be there convicted that then he the said W: Baly should pay and satisfy unto the said Mathew Cannon the Judgment of the Court thereupon as far as his Oath in Execution of such Judgment to the Prison of the Sheriff of the County of Somerset in such manner that he the said William Baly will do the same for him &c

Whereupon the said W: Baly put in his Oath William Steward Gent Attorney at Law Against the said Mathew Cannon of the said Exeter

And thereupon at the prayer of the said Mathew Cannon day is to them now here Given unto the Sheriff to be held at Brimston on the third Sunday of August the next following in the State the same being to the Satisfaction of the said Mathew Cannon

At which day here came the parties by their Attorneys as aforesaid hereupon the said Mathew Cannon complained Against the said W: Baly in the plea of in fine following Samuel of William Baly of Somerset County Planters was Admitted to Answer unto Mathew Cannon of Exeter of his charge upon the Case &c

And thereupon the said Mathew Cannon by Josiah Bell his Attorney complains that whereas the said William on the first day of January Come Down into thousand seven hundred and Eighty One at the County of Somerset was paid unto the said Mathew Cannon the sum of four pounds seven Shillings and six pence of Money of England for the Article in the Account here to be mentioned and the same of Judgement being the said William on Consideration thereof of aforesaid Court the day and hour of the County of Somerset himself did Assume unto the said Mathew Cannon and there faithfully Promise that he the said William when he should be there afterwards Required the sum of Money of unto the said Mathew Cannon he would faithfully pay and Content Never the less the said William his Promise and Assumption as in form aforesaid Made not Regarding the sum of Money of unto the said Mathew Cannon he hath not paid nor him for the same in any sort Contented but that he hath Refused and still doth Refuse all the Oaths to be sworn to wit the day and hour of the County
