Somerset Nov. 19. 1761 Then Came before me the Subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of Peace for the County of Somerset and made Oath upon the holy Evangelist of Almighty God that the above Account is just and true and that he has Received no part nor shall he receive any Satisfaction or Security for the same

James Houston and made Oath upon the holy Evangelist of Almighty God that he has Received no part nor shall he receive any Satisfaction or Security for the Account as here stated before

Whereas it is made appear to my Satisfaction by the Oath of James Houston that Daniel Smith is justly indebted unto him in the sum of four pounds ten Shillings and Nine pence and hath absconded from Justice and hath or is about to remove his Effects in Order to defraud his just Creditors - These are therefore in his Lordships Name to Authorize and Require you to Issue an Attachment for the said James Houston Against the Goods Chattels Rights and Credits of the said Daniel Smith for the sum of four pounds ten Shillings and Nine pence with the Judicial Costs thereon and this shall be your Warrant Given under my hand and Seal this Nineteenth day of November in the Year of our said One thousand Seven hundred and sixty One

To the Justices of the Peace of the County of Somerset
By Virtue of the above Warrant and Account Drawn up and the following Attachment
I do hereby Command you that you Attach any the Goods Chattels Rights and Credits of Daniel Smith Late of Somerset County Shire if they shall be found in your Bailiwick to the Value of four Pounds ten Shillings and Nine pence of Money and five hundred Pounds of Tobacco and if you have the same Attached or any Part thereof the same in your Bailiwick you shall have the same before me or Justice of your County Court of Somerset to be held at Business as soon as the third Tuesday of March next then and there to be examined according to Act of Parliament to and for the use of certain James Houston unless the said Daniel Smith by himself or his Attorney shall appear and answer unto the said James Houston in Copy of this Warrant and that by Good and Lawfull means of your Bailiwick you make known unto the Person or Persons in whose hands you make the same Attachment that he she or they be and appear before our Justice of your County Court of Somerset to be held as aforesaid the same if any be she or they have why the same Goods Chattels and Credits be Attached in his her or their hands ought not to be examined and taken therefrom and made according to Act of Parliament in such Case made and Provided if to him here then it shall seem meet and how you shall execute the Writ that you make known unto our said Justice at the day and place aforesaid and have you there this Writ Witness my hand and Seal this 22nd day of November 1761
At which said third Tuesday of March and 4th of June 1762 the said James Houston by George Stanger his Attorney and the Sheriff his John Welford was here Returned the said Writ of Attachment Dated in manner following with a Schedule thereto annexed
I do hereby Command you that you Attach any the Goods Chattels Rights and Credits of the said Daniel Smith to the Amount of four Pounds ten Shillings and Nine pence of Money and five hundred and seventy Pounds of Tobacco as appears by the Schedule of the said Writ annexed which I have hereunto annexed for the purposes in the said Writ mentioned -
