July 22nd Day 1762 There was James Coulbourn and Jonathan Bell Qualified to examine the within Commission signed to the Act of a Assembly of Maryland in such Case made and provided before Whately - Somerset County for The Deposition of Henry Lord aged fifty Two years or there about being sworn on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God depose that about sixteen years ago he was present when said John Piggon was examined by William Piggon and James Whately who was in Commission to examine Witnesses in Relation to the Land of said Nathaniel Daugherty then present declared as follows that the said Piggon said James said and himself and that he was going along the March that leads from Daugherty Landing to the plantation where Rachell Daugherty now lives in Company with said James when that time passed the said Nathaniel Williams was Linger on and that they came to a marked Pine which now stands in the Side of the March and that there hundred and eight the Yards from Daugherty Landing and found a servant Man belonging to the said James cutting the said Pine and that James did chide him in a harsh Manner and told him that he had divided the Land and the Land of Nathaniel Daugherty and that the Land to the Southward belonged to Daugherty and to the Northward belonged to him self and the Deposition further saith that the said Piggon declared it was a bound of part of said Land called Wood and the Deposition further saith that
