 Order to Defraud his just Creditors These are therefore in his said Oath's Name to Command you in behalf
 of the said Lewis Ballard to give an Attachment against the Goods and Chattels Right and Credit of the said
 William Knowles for the said sum of three pounds Nine Shillings and Six pence with the just Costs there
 hereof paid you under my hand and seal the 13th day of July Anno Domini 1662

 Bailiwick to the Value of three pounds Nine Shillings and Six pence all Money and five hundred pounds of
 Tobacco and when you have the same Attached or any part thereof the same in your Bailiwick to keep so that you
 have the same before our Justices of our County Court of Somerset to be held at Business Annam from the third
 Tuesday of August Next then and there to be condemned according to Act of Parliament to answer the sum of
 a certain Lewis Ballard unless the said William Knowles by himself or his Attorney shall appear and
 answer unto the said Lewis Ballard in plain of trespass for the Case & according to Law and that by good
 and Lawfull means of you Bailiwick you make known unto the person or Persons in whose hands you may
 the same Attachment that he she - they be and appear before our Justices of our County Court of Somerset to be
 held as aforesaid the Case if any he she - they have why the same Goods Chattels and Credits be Attached in
 his her or their hands Ought not to be condemned and Execution thereof had and made according to Act of
