William Shurin To the worshipfull Justices of Somerset County Court now judicially sitting the petition of William  
Pet <sup>Re</sup> Shurin humbly sheweth that he hath a Negro called Will hundred altogether incapable of  
Labour Both by age as well as other infirmities wherefore hope your Worships will set the a<sup>d</sup> Negro Tax free &  
your petitioner as in Duty Bound will ever pray William Shurin  
Wherupon came here into Court the a<sup>d</sup> Petition in his proper person & therupon the petition as being  
Read & Heard & fully understood it is considered by the court how that the a<sup>d</sup> Negro Will be Tax free till it please  
God to restore him to Health & be able to labour

W Nicholas McTubbin His Lordship the Lord proply directed his writ to the sheriff here in these words  
The Tyler bail of John Somerset Frederick absolute & proply of provinces of Maryland and St. C<sup>t</sup>on.  
Said Baron of Baltimore &c To the sheriff of Somerset County greeting wherwas a certain Thomas Tyler late  
in our County Court of Somerset held at princeps Ann Town to wit the sixteenth Day of March Anno  
Domini one thousand seven hundred and sixty two before Isaac Hardy Esq<sup>r</sup> and others his associates Justices  
at princeps Ann Town a<sup>d</sup> undertook for a certain Isha Tyldale of Somerset County planter otherwise all  
as Isha Tyler of Somerset County in the province of Waterman and the same John McTubbin and others present in the  
same Court before our Said Justices assumed upon himself that if it should happen that he the a<sup>d</sup> John in a certain  
sum of debt for fifty six pounds ten shillings and Money of Maryland against him by one Nicholas McTubbin  
in the same Court before our Justices how Prosecuted and in a Lawfull Manner should be convicted and Judge  
ment for the same Nicholas against the a<sup>d</sup> John in the same Court should be rendered that then he the  
same John the a<sup>d</sup> Debt and also all the Damages as to him the said Nicholas by Occasion of the Deten  
tion of the a<sup>d</sup> Debt against him the said John in our same Court how should be specified or in any man  
ner adjudged he would satisfy on his body in Execution to the prison of the sheriff of the County a<sup>d</sup> in  
satisfaction of such Judgement he would render or that the said Thomas Tyler would do the same  
for him and altho the a<sup>d</sup> Nicholas afterward to wit the seventeenth Day of August and Year a<sup>d</sup> in  
our same Court before the a<sup>d</sup> Isaac Hardy and his associates then our Justices of our County Court of So  
merset held at princeps Ann Town and by consideration of the same Court recovered against the a<sup>d</sup>  
John Tyler as well the a<sup>d</sup> Debt of Fifty six pounds ten shillings and Money of Maryland as  
Three Hundred and forty seven pounds of Tobacco which to the same Nicholas in our same Court were  
adjudged for his Damages which had by Occasion of the Detention of the same Debt whereof he is convict  
ed by the Record and proceedings thereof in our same Court before our Justices at princeps Ann Town a<sup>d</sup> now  
Remaining manifestly appeareth Neverthelss the a<sup>d</sup> John him the said Nicholas the Debt and Damages  
a<sup>d</sup> hath not as yet satisfied nor in no wise Rendered his body in Execution of such Judgement for Debt  
and Damages a<sup>d</sup> to the prison of the sheriff of the County a<sup>d</sup> according to the form and Effect of the Recognizance  
a<sup>d</sup> as by the Information of the same Nicholas in our same Court we have received and because we are wil  
ling that these things which in our same Court are Rightly Done should be Duly Executed We command  
you by honest and Lawfull men of Your Bailywick you make known unto the said Thomas Tyler  
that he be before our Justices at our Next Court to be held at princeps Ann Town in and for the County of  
the third Tuesday of March then Next following to show cause if any thing for himself he hath or hatnot to say  
why the said Nicholas ought not to have his Execution Against him for his said Debt and Damages a<sup>d</sup>  
according to the form and Effect of the Recognizance a<sup>d</sup> to him it shall seem Expeditious and have effect  
and have the names of them by whom to him you make known and his wife witness Sampson Wheately Eliz<sup>e</sup> one of  
our Justices of our said Court the 20 Day of November in the 11 Year of our Domination A<sup>d</sup> 1762 / At
