Wherupon came here into Court the a^d Petitioner in his proper person & thereupon the petition of being Read & Heard fully understood it is considered by the Court here that the a^d Negro Peter be tax free un till it please God to restore him to Health and he be able to Labour

William Skirvin To the worshipfull Justices of Somerset County Court now Judicially sitting the petition of William Skirvin humbly sheweth that he hath a Negro called Will Bonded altogether incapable of Labour Both by age as well as other infirmities therefore here your Worships will set the a^d Negro Tax free & your petitioner as in Duty bound will ever pray William Skirvin
Wherupon came here into Court the a^d Petitioner in his proper person & thereupon the petition of being Read & Heard fully understood it is considered by the Court here that the a^d Negro Will be Tax free till it please God to restore him to Health & he be able to Labour

W. Nicholas W. Culbin His Lordship the Lord properly directed his writs to the sheriff here in these words
The Tyler bail of John Somerset & Frederick absolute & properly of y^e provinces of Maryland and New York Lord Baron of Baltimore &c To the sheriff of Somerset County greeting whereas a certain Thomas Tyler lately in our County Court of Somerset hold at princeps Ann Town to wit the sixteenth Day of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and sixty two before Isaac Handy Esq^r and others his associates Justices at princeps Ann Town a^d undertook for a certain John Tyler late of Somerset County planter therein call'd John Tyler of Somerset County in the province of Waterman and the same John then and there present in the same Court before our said Justices assumed upon himself that if it should happen that he the a^d John in a certain plea of Debt for fifty six pounds ten shillings Curr Money of Maryland against him by one Nicholas W. Culbin in the same Court before our Justices then prosecuted and in a lawfull manner should be convicted and Judgment for the same Nicholas against the a^d John in the same Court should be rendered that then he the same John the a^d Debt and also all the Damages as to him the said Nicholas by Occasion of the Detention of the a^d Debt against him the said John in our same Court here should be absolved or in any manner adjudged he would satisfy on his body in Execution to the prison of the sheriff of the County a^d in satisfaction of such Judgment he would render or that the said Thomas Tyler would do the same for him and altho the a^d Nicholas afterwards to wit the seventeenth Day of August and Year a^d in our same Court before the a^d Isaac Handy and his associates then our Justices of our County Court of Somerset hold at princeps Ann Town a^d and by consideration of the same Court recovered against the a^d John Tyler as well the a^d Debt of Fifty six pounds ten shillings Curr Money of Maryland as three Hundred and forty seven pounds of Tobacco which to the same Nicholas in our same Court were adjudged for his Damages which had by Occasion of the Detention of the same Debt whereof he is convicted as by the Record and proceedings thereof in our same Court before our Justices at princeps Ann Town a^d now remaining manifestly appeareth Nevertheless the a^d John him the said Nicholas the Debt and Damages a^d hath not as yet satisfied nor in no wise rendered his body in Execution of such Judgment for Debt and Damages a^d to the prison of the sheriff of the County a^d according to the form and Effect of the Recognizance a^d as by the Information of the same Nicholas in our same Court we have received and because we are willing that those things which in our same Court are Rightly Done should be duly Executed We command you by honest and Lawfull men of Your Bailiwick you make known unto the said Thomas Tyler that he be before our Justices at our next Court to be hold at princeps Ann Town in and for the County of the third tuesday of March then Next following to show cause if any thing for himself he hath or hath to say why the said Nicholas ought not to have his Execution Against him for his said Debt and Damages a^d according to the force form and Effect of the Recognizance a^d if to him it shall seem Expedient and have you then and there the names of them by whom to him you make known and this writ with safe Sampson Wheatly Esq^r and our Justices of our said Court the 20 Day of November in the 2^d Year of our Dominion &c. Anns Domini 1762 Thomas Heyward J^r
