halfpenny Cur. Money therefore if the abovesaid Thomas Summers, William Miles, & Thomas Esau them or any
of them their or any of their heirs Ex^{ors} Adm^{ors} do and shall well & truly pay or cause to be paid unto the
abovesaid Representatives the sum of Thirty nine pounds Ten shillings and eight pence halfpenny
Cur. Money according to act of assembly then the above obligation to be void & to Remain in full force and virtue

the fifteenth day of the same Month Anno Dom 1763 before the Justices thereof came Levin Wilson and
