

The Deposition of Joseph Lotman aged forty eight Years or thereabouts being first sworn on the holy Evangel of Almighty God Deposeth and saith that he has been acquainted with the head of Stalls Creek about thirty years and that he used to be sent with Cattle to the Marshes that when he used to ride the old main Road when the Tides was high went round the head of Stalls Creek through the woods and that where the post now stands was called by the people the head of Stalls Creek and that the Tides then flowed above the main Road to the best of his Knowledge & further saith not sworn the day & Year aforesaid Joseph Lotman

The Deposition of Nathaniel Roach aged forty seven Years or thereabouts being first sworn on the holy Evangel of Almighty God Deposeth and saith that he hath been acquainted with the head of Stalls Creek from his youth and that where the main Road crossed was always deemed to be the head of Stalls Creek and this Dependant further saith that his Father John Treharne told him where the main road crossed a little above was called the head of Stalls Creek and this Dependant says that where the post now stands was always called the head of the above Creek to the best of his Knowledge & further saith not sworn the day & Year aforesaid Nat. Roach

The Deposition of James Treharne aged forty seven years or thereabouts being first sworn on the holy Evangel of Almighty God Deposeth and saith that about thirty years past that he was riding along with his father and coming a cross a small creek or gut asked his father what place that was and his Father John Treharne told him that it was the head of Stalls Creek & this Dependant then saw the Tides flowing over the old Road which was about six Yards above a marked Cedar post now set up and this Dependant further saith that it was no more than a common Tides that he saw flow over the Road above mentioned and further this Dependant saith not sworn the day & Year aforesaid James Treharne

The Deposition of Samuel Tull aged fifty seven Years or thereabouts being first sworn on the holy Evangel of Almighty God Deposeth saith that he was born at or near the head of Tull's Creek & brought up there and has been acquainted with the head thereof until the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & twenty seven and saith that within six years where now stands a Cedar post marked with sixteen Notches is the head of Swanny Creek but now called Tull's Creek and further this Dependant saith that an overflowing Tides flowed over the whole marsh and that forty yards or thereabouts below the post above mentioned the creek was full of Tulpin and further this Dependant saith not taken this 8<sup>th</sup> Day of November in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty two Samuel Tull

The Deposition of James Treharne aged forty seven Years or thereabouts being first sworn on the holy Evangel of Almighty God Deposeth saith that he has been acquainted with the head of Tull's Creek about thirty two years that where now stands a marked Cedar Post within four yards above or below the said post is the head of the said Creek and that the Creek had Tulpin in it below the post as mentioned in Samuel Tull's Deposition and this Dependant further saith that about a lane could come no higher up than forty or fifty yards below the said Post to the best of his knowledge and further this Dependant saith not taken the day and Year aforesaid James Treharne

The Deposition of Nathaniel Roach aged forty six Years or thereabouts being first sworn on the holy Evangel of Almighty God Deposeth saith that he was born brought and lived near Tull's Creek and that where now stands a marked Cedar post is the head of the above Creek or thereabouts and that Thomas Cullen who lived near the head of the aforesaid Creek told this Dependant that where the said post stands was the head of the Creek aforesaid and that there was Tulpin in the Creek forty or fifty yards below the said post and that he this Dependant used to go over on the said Tulpin at low water of half tide and high water used to go over where the post now stands to the best of his knowledge and further this Dependant saith not taken
