Mitchell him the said Robert the Debt & Damages of hath not as yet satisfied nor in no wise Rendered his body in Execution of such Judgement for the Debt and Damages of to the prison of the sheriff of the county of according to the form and effect of the Recognizances of as by the Information of the same Robert in our same Court we have received and because we are willing that these things which in our same Court are rightly done should be duly executed We command you that by honest and Lawfull men of your bailiwick you make known unto the ap. Thomas Ralph that he before our Justices at our next Court to be held at Princes Ann Town in and for the county of the third tuesday of June then next following to show cause if any thing for himself he hath or know to say why the said Robert Hardy ought not to have his Execution against him for his said Debt and Damages of according to the force form and effect of the Recognizance of if to him it shall seem expedient and have you there the names of those by whom to him you make the same known and this writ witness Sampson Wheatly Esq. one of our Justices of our said Court the 19 Day of March in the 12 year of our Dominion of Anno Domini 1763

Robert Hardy have Execution against the ap. Thomas Ralph for the damages of in the same manner as mentioned according to the force form and effect of the Recognizance of also it is considered that the ap. Robert Hardy recover against the ap. Thomas Ralph pounds of Tobacco for his costs and charges sustained by means of the delay of the Execution of the Judgement of and that the ap. Robert have thereof Execution.
