Indebted unto the said Outerbridge in the sum of four pounds and six pence Current Money of Maryland for the articles and things in the account hereto annexed mentioned and so thereof debted being the said said George in consideration thereof afterwards (to wit) the same day and year as at the county of upon himself did assume and to the said Outerbridge then and there faithfully did promise that when afterwards he should be thereto required the aforesaid sum of four pounds and six pence Current money aforesaid to the said Outerbridge he would well and faithfully pay and content. Never theless the said George his promise and assumption aforesaid in form aforesaid made with regard but minding and fraudulently Intending the same Outerbridge in that part craftily and Subtly to deceive and defraud he the said George the aforesaid sum of four pounds and six pence Current Money aforesaid to the same Outerbridge hath not paid or him for the same in any sort contented altho the said George afterwards (to wit) the same day and year aforesaid at the county aforesaid by him the said Outerbridge was thereto requested but the said George the same to do hitherto altogether hath refused and still doth Refuse and unjustly deny whereby the same Outerbridge says he is worse and hath Damage to the Value of eight pounds and one shilling like Money thereof he brings suit and so forth

Errors excepted of Outerbridge Money  
 A copy of the foregoing declaration was read and sent to be served on the def in order for grand Jury all which day here came the aforesaid Outerbridge Horsey by his Attorney aforesaid and the sheriff to wit Ephraim Wilson now here returned that the aforesaid George Haster was not found in his bailwick &c. And afterwards in the same court came the aforesaid George

Haster by Josiah Polk his Attorney and ofod himself against the said Outerbridge Horsey and was willing to give the said Outerbridge Horsey special Bail to the Suit aforesaid. Thereupon a certain William Haster of Somerset County planter present here in court in his proper person undertook for the said George Haster and assumed upon himself that if it should happen that Judgement in the plea aforesaid should be rendered for the said Outerbridge Horsey against the aforesaid George Haster or that he the said George should be therein convicted that then he the said George should pay and satisfy unto the aforesaid Outerbridge Horsey the Judgement of the court thereupon or render his body in Execution of such judgement to the prison of the sheriff of the county aforesaid in satisfaction thereof or that he the said William Haster will do the same for him. And hereupon the said George Haster by Josiah Polk his Attorney comes and defends the force Injury when it and saith that he cannot deny the action aforesaid of the aforesaid Outerbridge Horsey nor that he did assume upon himself in manner and form as the aforesaid Outerbridge Horsey above against him hath complained and as to the Damage of the same Outerbridge by him by occasion of the premises in that part sustained the same George Haster saith and acknowledged that the aforesaid Outerbridge hath sustained Damages by occasion of the premises beyond his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part opposed to three pounds nineteen shillings six pence Curr. Money and not more and because the aforesaid Outerbridge Horsey denies not this but the same Allegation grants to be true prays Judgement for these Damages above acknowledged together with his costs and charges aforesaid to him to be adjudged. Therefore by consent of the parties aforesaid it is considered that the aforesaid Outerbridge Horsey Recover against the aforesaid George Haster his Damages aforesaid to the aforesaid three pounds Nineteen shillings and six pence Curr. Money by the aforesaid George in form aforesaid acknowledged as also
