And hereupon the ap^d George Scott adm^r as ap^d then and there his writ and declaration ap^d
against the ap^d Thomas Slope did not prosecute with effect but voluntarily suffered his suit
to be discontinued &

if he should be found in his bailwick & him should safe keep so that he might have his body
before the Justices of his Lordships county court of Somersets to be held at princeps Ann Town the

Charles Redding of a plea of trespass upon the case & the same day is given to the ap^d Charles
here & At which day here came the ap^d Charles Redding by George Hayward his
Attorney and the sheriff to wit Ephraim Wilson now here returned that he had taken the ap^d
Stephen Garland where body here at this day he had ready to answer the ap^d Charles Redding of
the ap^d plea as to him it was commanded & Whereupon the said Stephen Garland
puts in his place William Hayward Gent^l Attorney at Law against the ap^d Charles Redding of the ap^d plea
And hereupon the prayer of the parties ap^d day is to them now here given untill next Court to be
held at princeps Ann Town the third tuesday of August then next following in the state that
