

to & for y^e use of a certain John Scarborough unless the said George Buchanan and William Hamilton by themselves or their Attorneys shall appear & answer unto y^e said John Scarborough in a plea of trespass upon y^e case according to Law that by good lawfull men of your bailiwick you make knowne unto y^e person or persons in whose hands you make y^e same Attachment that he she or they be and appear before our Justices of our County Court of Somerset to be held as aforesaid to shew cause if any he she or they have why y^e same Goods Chattels & credits so attached in his her or their hands ought not to be condemned Execution thereof had. Made according to act of assembly in such case made & provided if to him her or them it shall seem meet how you shall Execute this writ that you make known unto our said Justices at y^e day & place aforesaid have you there this writ with help Robert King Esq^r Chief Justice of our said Court y^e 10 day of August In y^e 2^d year of our dominion Anno Dom^o 1752

At which day here came the aforesaid John Scarborough by William Hayward his Attorney and the sheriff to wit Jeremiah King now here returned the foregoing writ of Attachment & did so in manner following - - - Somerset County sh^r I do hereby certify that by virtue of the within writ to me directed on the nineteenth day of August in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and fifty two within my Bailiwick I attached of the goods Chattels and credits of George Buchanan and William Hamilton, to the Value of thirteen pounds Sterling and eight hundred pounds of Tobacco in the within writ mentioned in the hands of Mr George Gale and Alexander Adams severally and I do further certify that by John Doe and Richard Row good and lawfull men within my Bailiwick I made known unto the said Mr George Gale and Alexander Adams severally that they be and appear before the Justices within mentioned at the Time and place within specified to shew cause and so forth as by that writ I am commanded & to answer. Alking their And the aforesaid Alexander Adams Garnishes of the aforesaid George Buchanan & William Hamilton by Robert Tenchins Henry his Attorney comes and prays leave thereof to Imparle here untill next Court to be held at princeps Ann Town the third tuesday of March then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid John Scarborough here also and so forth. At which day here came as well the aforesaid John Scarborough as the aforesaid Alexander Adams Garnishes as aforesaid by their Attorneys aforesaid and hereupon the aforesaid Alexander prays further leave thereof to Imparle here untill next Court to be held at princeps Ann Town the third tuesday of June then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid John Scarborough here also & so forth. At which day here came as well the aforesaid John Scarborough as the aforesaid Alexander Adams Garnishes as aforesaid by their Attorneys aforesaid and hereupon the aforesaid Alexander prays further leave thereof to Imparle here untill next Court to be held at princeps Ann Town the third tuesday of August then next following & he hath it & the same day is given to the aforesaid John Scarborough here also & so forth. At which day here came as well the aforesaid John Scarborough as the aforesaid Alexander Adams Garnishes as aforesaid by their Attorneys aforesaid and hereupon the aforesaid Alexander prays further leave thereof to Imparle here untill next Court to be held at princeps Ann Town the third tuesday of November then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid John Scarborough here also & so forth. And hereupon the aforesaid George Buchanan & William Hamilton by Sillerton Denme their Attorney come and say that they the aforesaid George & William are ready to answer unto the aforesaid John Scarborough in a plea of trespass upon the case according to Law and to give him the said John Scarborough special bail to the aforesaid plea and to stand and abide the Judgement of the Court thereupon and so forth. Thereupon a certain Henry Dawes of Somerset County present here in Court in his proper person undertook for the said George Buchanan & William Hamilton (each of them) and assumed upon himself that if it should happen that Judgement in the plea aforesaid should be rendered for the said John Scarborough against the aforesaid George Buchanan & William Hamilton or that the said George & William should be therewith convicted that then they the said George & William should pay and satisfy unto the aforesaid John Scarborough the Judgement of the Court thereupon or render themselves in Execution of such Judgement to the prison of the sheriff of the county aforesaid in satisfaction hereof or that he the said Henry Dawes will do the same for them &c. Whereupon the aforesaid John Scarborough complained against the aforesaid George Buchanan & William Hamilton in the plea aforesaid in form following.
