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William Dusharow of Somerset & Frederick absolute Lord and Proprietary of y<sup>e</sup> provinces of Maryland  
commissioner & fiduciary C. Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c To Louther Dashiell, Thomas Dashiell,  
Isaac Dashiell, & John Adams of Somerset County Gentlemen greeting know ye that we have  
appointed you or any three or two of you to be our commissioners to examine evidences on behalf  
of a certain William Dusharow of Somerset County in Relation to y<sup>e</sup> bounds of a tract of  
Land called Fuzels Enjoyment or y<sup>e</sup> bounds of any other Land on which y<sup>e</sup> same may depend  
We therefore require you or any three or two of you at some time & place as to you or any three  
or two of you it shall be convenient you meet on y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid Land called Fuzels Enjoy-  
ment or any other Land on which y<sup>e</sup> bounds of the aforesaid Land may depend you first having  
taken your oaths on y<sup>e</sup> holy Evangelist of Almighty God there cause to come before you or  
any three or two of you all such evidences as shall be to you or any three or two of you nominated  
by the said complainant or defendant & that you or any three or two of you examine  
them upon their corporal oaths to be by you or any three or two of you administered on y<sup>e</sup> holy  
Evangelist of Almighty God in the presence of the complainant or defendant if any touching  
y<sup>e</sup> truth or remembrance of their knowledge or anything that may relate to y<sup>e</sup> cause aforesaid  
that reducing y<sup>e</sup> several depositions into writing you send y<sup>e</sup> same with this our commission  
under your or any three or two of your hands & seals to us to our county court of Somerset without  
convenient speed witness Isaac Hardy Esq<sup>r</sup> one of our Justices of our said court y<sup>e</sup> Twenty first  
day of August in y<sup>e</sup> tenth year of our dominion & annoque Domini 1760  
And now to will at a court of his Lordship held at Prince of Ann Town the third Tuesday of June  
being the twenty first day of the same Month anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and sixty  
three before the Justices whose came Louther Dashiell and Thomas Dashiell two of the Gentlemen  
nominated in the above commission and returned the same endorsed in manner following  
with the several depositions thereto annexed

March 19<sup>th</sup> 1761 This day was the within mentioned W<sup>m</sup> Louther Dashiell & W<sup>m</sup> Thomas Dashiell  
qualified to execute the within commission — Before Eph<sup>m</sup> Wilson  
Depositions of witnesses taken on the Land called Fuzels Enjoyment on behalf of W<sup>m</sup>  
Dusharow the 27<sup>th</sup> day of May 1761 Joseph Stanford aged sixty six years or thereabouts  
being sworn on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God saith that about forty two or forty three  
years agoe James Chadwick showed him a pine tree and told him it was John Fuzels bound-  
er which Pine stood at or near where there is a cedar post fixed and that the Pine  
was then a living tree with sixteen notches on the four sides and that upwards of twenty  
years agoe this deponent was talking with Nicholas Scadore about the Land on Parson  
dike branch and told the s<sup>r</sup> Scadore he knew where John Fuzels boun<sup>d</sup>er stood and  
that it was a pine no says Scadore that is not the boun<sup>d</sup>er the boun<sup>d</sup>er is a white oak  
why where does that stand says this deponent and Scadore replies it stands a very  
little way from that pine towards Marys bottom and further spitts not as  
Javis Jenkins aged eighty years or thereabouts being sworn & Joseph E<sup>r</sup> Stanford  
saith that upwards of forty years agoe he saw a red oak tree marked in the form of a  
boun<sup>d</sup>er which stood very near where the cedar post now stands that mentioned in  
Stanfords depositions and that the Neighbour used to tell him that the Oak was the  
boun<sup>d</sup>er of John Fuzels Land but he doth not remember that any person was ever with  
him at the afores<sup>d</sup> tree but the neighbours told him that such an oak standing in such  
a place was the boun<sup>d</sup>er of John Fuzels Land and further saith not Javis E<sup>r</sup> Jenkins

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
