About 20 years ago he went to school Down the neck against Mr. John  
Leatherbump and boarded at James Jones and commonly went home to his  
Mother Robert Joneses of Saturdays and back again of Mondays and at  
times Crossed Creek from William Joneses Landing John Jones Landing Brother  
of Mr. James Jones went a Cup of Creek with him at times and went a  
Shore at a Landing then called Mr. Broad Landing and going by a marked  
Hickory of Sale Mr. Jones told him that was the Beginning of the  
Division between his Mother James Jones and Daniel Jones the said  
Tree stood to the Eastward and some time before or after he was walking  
with the aforesaid James Jones through the field going over Mr. Division  
Jones by a haw tree that the Division line was that tree and that Daniel  
held some of his land near of Creek and he held some of Daniels by wood

of Marsh that makes from Great mommy Creek above a Landing now called Mr. Broad  
Landing & of said James shewed this Deponent a Hickory Standing on the North  
Side of said Glade of Marsh near the edge of the bank of said James said it was a  
Divisional Tree between him & Daniel Jones, and said James told him that the  
Division line between him & Daniel Jones was near a Haw Bush Standing  
in of field of Daniel Jones & further saith not

Thomas Jones

The Deposition of Robert Jones aged 153 years or thereabouts saith that some  
time in James Jones's lifetime he shewed this Deponent a marked Hickory  
Standing near a Landing now called Mr. Broad Landing & of said James said  
it was a boundary of the Division between him & Daniel Jones & that the course  
from thence whether I run it not I cannot say but if not he said of course went  
under a haw tree and there was then a Division fence between them which had  
stood many years in that place & of said James told this Deponent that out  
the Creek Daniel Jones had part of his Land within of aforesaid fence and next  
the Woods he held part of Daniels within of fence aforesaid & further saith not
