there about being Sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God Deposeth as
follows (viz) that about Twenty years ago he & said Langford was a Chain
Carrier to lay of some Land for Capt. Holland and that they began at a marked
Sedar post which is now gone and from thence they run South fifty five Degrees
West to another Oak being a first bound of a Tract of Land called Crompett
about thirty two poles and a half distant from & of post which said Sedar post
