Thirty first day of July 1736 This affirmation being duly examined with Testimony and taken that being in Company with a Certain John Waller on a hammock astride at the Mouth of Little Knight Creek & below the mouth of a Creek called Little Creek the said John Waller showed this Deponent a Stump a little below the said Hammock landing on or by an Oyster shell Bank and told this Affirmant that it was one of the Boundaries of a Tract of Land on Marsh taken by a Certain Benjamin Soper the said Soper removed to North Carolina further saith not
Geo. Soper

Jan'y 31. 1756 The Deposition of Geo. Irving aged forty two years or there about being sworn on the Holy Evangelist & Almighty God Depoeth saith that About sixteen or eighteen years past he this Deponent was in Company with John Waller the Deed at the Mouth of Little Knight Creek on a place called the Hammock & the said John Waller showed him this Deponent and where a Boundary stood which of the John Waller said was a Boundary of Wm. Soper's Land and Marsh the Deponent then declared you declared to be about eighty yds from the said Creek of Little Knight at the north end of the Island further saith not

Jan'y 24. 1756 The Deposition of Jno. Lawrence of Dorset County aged eighty years or there about being sworn on the Holy Evangelist & Almighty God Depoeth saith that this June a Gum stump now in View formerly a Standing Tree as he had been told by Country persons about forty years agoe was a Boundary of the Banter Lands the said stump stood to the Southward of the Main Road where it now lies where there is now fixed a marked post with sixteen Nails and further saith not
Jno. Lawrence

Jan'y 24. 1756 Thomas Wallace of Somerset County aged thirty eight years or there about being sworn on the Holy Evangelist & Almighty God Depoeth as follows that about twelve years past the Deponent saith he was in Company with Robt. Lawrence of the said County the said Robt. Lawrence told this Deponent that the stump now in View being a Gum stump but then a standing Tree was the first Boundary of a certain Gum stump with further saith that he received the Gum stump when there is now a narrow Lane Road marked with sixteen Nails about two yards to the Southward of a Gum stump standing in a Low Swamp about 100 yds from the said Marsh of the head of Little Creek about forty paces to the North Side

July 20. 1756 George Wallace of Dorchester County aged thirty six years or there about being sworn on the Holy Evangelist & Almighty God Depoeth as follows that about ten or eleven years past he told Robt. Lawrence of the said County that he was in Company with the said Robt. Lawrence showed him this Deponent a marked Gum stump standing near the head of Little Creek to which this Deponent it was the first Boundary of some thing with it being the same as is described in the above Deposition of Thomas Lawrence further saith not

July 20. 1756 Edward Robert of Somerset County aged Sixty three years or there about being sworn on the Holy Evangelist & Almighty God Depoeth as follows
