Slaver on the xxv day of October In the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred fifty and nine with force and Arms at the Parish of ... in the County of Staffs invaded upon a Certain Elizabeth Evans in the name of God, the said Lord properly then there being and Assault did make her the said Elizabeth Evans then she beat wound and Evilly Treater that of her life it was much repaired and other Harms to him the said Elizabeth then she did to the great Damage of the said Elizabeth against the peace of the right Honorable the said High Court that now is his good rule and Government.

Thereupon it is commanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the said William Gammell if he should be found in his Bailiwick, him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Princes Arms Tavern the third Tuesday of March next to come (the third day of March) ever to be called and to answer unto his Lordship and concerning the indictment aforesaid.

At which said time and place the said William Gammell in his own defence hath bearing of the indictment aforesaid and saith that he is not guilty and that he is not liable upon the Countersort Mayward Gend. which his said Lordship in that part followeth. Therefore he immediately became bound the King to be his Lordships Justice there by whom and within 40 days before the said day of John Dennis Sher. of the County of Staffs and James Dickson, Southy Whittington, Abraham Cutler Thomas Young and George Day to be called came to say the truth of the premises being called by their Oath and sworn upon their Oath by that the said William Gammell is not guilty of the premises and in the indictment aforesaid specified in manner and form as the said W. for himself above by his plea hath alleged upon which it is considered by the Court here that the said W. the premises aforesaid in the indictment aforesaid be discharged and goe without day.

And the said Lordship doth know for his Lordship the right Honorable the said High Court that now is for the County of Somerset County upon their Oath present that Edward Bush Late of Stepney Parish in the County of Staffs on the xii day of July in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred sixty with force and Arms at the Parish of ... in the County of Staffs invaded upon a Certain John Stokes in the name of God and the said Lord properly then there being and Assault did make and him the said John Stokes then she beat wound, willy heart so that of her life it was much repaired and other Harms to the said John Stokes then she did to the great Damage of the said John Stokes and against the peace of his said Lordship that now is his good rule and Government. Thereupon it is commanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Edward Bush if he should be found in his Bailiwick, him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Princes Arms Tavern.
