Whereupon Came hereinto Court the Petitioner in his proper person and thereupon the Petition being read and heard and fully understood it is Considered by the Court here that Thomas Gillis and William Bell Lay out a Road from the Road by George Bell to the head of the Creech the petition mentioned and that Thomas Bell be Overseer of the Road and have his own, W. Dunscombe, David Bell, Jonathan Bell, to be his Surveyors.
