Waller late of Somerset County Blacksmith otherwise called Richard Waller of Dorchester County in the province of Maryland Blacksmith if he should be found in his Bailwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Brims Ann Town the third Tuesday of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and sixty One to answer unto Mary Annallor and William Linnals Executors of the testament and Last will of Joseph Linnals of Dorchester County deceased of Ayles that he Render unto them the sum of Twenty one pound seven Shillings and four pence of Money of Maryland which from them he unjustly detains and seith and the same day is given to the said Mary Annallor her -

At which day here came the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals by William Hayward their Attorney - and the Sheriff with John Dennis Gardner here Returned that he had taken the said Richard Waller whose body here at this day he had Ready to Answer the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals of the said plea to him -

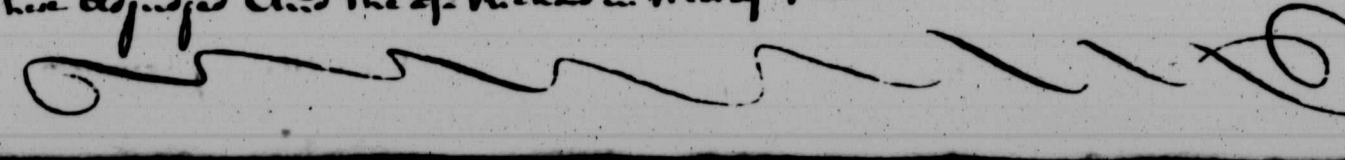
Commanded Whereupon the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals by their Attorney declared Against the said Richard Waller in the plea of - from following - Somerset wit Richard Waller late of Somerset County Blacksmith otherwise called Richard Waller of Dorchester County in the province of Maryland Blacksmith was summoned to Answer unto Mary Annallor and William Linnals Executors of the testament and Last will of Joseph Linnals of Dorchester County deceased of Ayles that he Render them twenty One pound seven Shillings and four pence of Money of Maryland which from them he unjustly detains and seith -

And Whereupon the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals by William Hayward their Attorney say that Whereas the said Richard in the Lifetime of the said Joseph twit on the sixth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty four at Dorchester twit at Somerset County of by his Certain Writing Obligatory which the said Joseph with the seal of the said Richard sealed hereinto Court doth bring the date whereof is the same day and year of Acknowledged himself to be had and firmly Bound unto the said Joseph in his Lifetime in the said sum of Twenty One pound seven Shillings and four pence of Money of Maryland to be paid to the said Joseph Linnals his heirs &c. or Assigns when he the said Richard should be thereto lawfully Required - Nevertheless the said Richard altho after Required the said sum of Twenty One pound seven Shillings and four pence of Money of Maryland to the said Joseph in his Lifetime or unto the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals or to either of them since the Death of the said Joseph he hath not paid but the same to them or either of them to pay hath Refused and unjustly detained to the manifest Delay of the Execution of the Last Will and Testament of the said Joseph Whereupon the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals say they have Damages to the Value of Twenty One pound seven Shillings and four pence of Money of Maryland and therefore they bring Suit and seith and bring hereinto Court the Letters Testamentary of the said Joseph by which it fully Appereth to the Court here that the said Mary Annallor and the said William Linnals Executors of the testament and Last will of the said Joseph do have thereof Administration &c.

And the said Richard Waller in his proper person Cometh and Defendeth the force and injury whereof the said Smith that he cannot deny the Action of the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals but that the Writing Obligatory of the said Richard Waller is the deed of him the said Richard Waller nor that he detains from the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals the said Forty Six pounds one Shilling and four pence of Money in Manner and form as the said Mary Annallor and William Linnals above Against him hath declared -
