peace in and for the County of Somerset Grace Milbourn Spinier of Coventry Baysh
of the County of Dorset and made Oath on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God that
A certain John Saw was the father or Mother of the Bastard Child that was
Satety born of her body and therefore was fined thirty shillings Current
Money of Maryland and there paid the same and a warrant was then
issued for the Deposed father By Samuel Addams Esq.

hundred and fifty nine Personally Came before me the Subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of the peace
for the County of Somerset Elizabeth Jones and was charged with bearing of her body a bastard Child and
the said Elizabeth saith that she cannot deny but that she was guilty thereof and was willing to pay her fine for the
same and made Oath that a certain Thomas Newman was the father of the bastard Child she had charged for the
same and thereupon the said Elizabeth Jones was by me fined the sum of thirty shillings Current Money of Maryland for the
offence of which she paid down 5/- Given under my hand and seal the day and year P. for Gillis

The same Somerset County Be it Remembred that on the fourth day of December Anno Domini one thousand seven
hundred and fifty nine Personally Came before me the Subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of the peace
for the County of Somerset Thomas Newman and was by me charged with bearing of a bastard
Child on his body of Elizabeth Jones and the said Thomas saith that he cannot deny but that he is guilty of the same
and is willing to pay his fine for the same 5/- Thereupon the said Thomas Newman was by me fined for the offence
of the sum of thirty shillings Current Money of Maryland which he paid down 5/- Thereupon the said Thomas Newman
was ordered to give security to save and keep indemnified the Justices of Somerset County Court from all Costs Charges
and expenses that might Accidentally ensue of the Birth and Maintenance of the said Child 5/- Thereupon the
said Thomas Newman together with Jane Newman of Somerset County planters Acknowledged themselves free and acquitted
of the said High Treason the said Deposition in the sum of thirty shillings Current Money of Maryland to be levied on their
Body Goods or Chattels Lands and Tenements together and severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship if
it happen that the said Thomas Newman do not save and keep indemnified the Justices of Somerset County Court
from all Costs Charges and Troubles that may Accidentally ensue of the Birth of the said Child Item of the body of
a certain Elizabeth Jones 5/- Given under my hand and seal the day and year P. for Joseph Gillis

The same Somerset County Be it Remembred that on the third day of January Anno Domini one thousand seven
hundred and sixty Personally Came before me the Subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of the peace for the
County of Somerset Elizabeth Macaul and was charged with bearing of a bastard Child of her body and the said Elizabeth
saith that she cannot deny but that she is guilty thereof and was willing to pay her fine for the same and made Oath
that a certain David Brownrigg was the father thereof Thereupon the said Elizabeth Macaul was by me fined for the
same the sum of thirty shillings Current Money of Maryland which she paid down 5/- Given under my hand and seal the day and year P.
for Joseph Gillis

The same Somerset County Be it Remembred that on the seventh day of January Anno Domini one thousand seven
hundred and sixty Personally Came before me the Subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of the peace for the County
of Somerset David Brownrigg and was charged with bearing of a bastard Child on the body of a certain Elizabeth Macaul and the
said David saith that he cannot deny but that he is guilty of the same and was willing to pay his fine for the same
Thereupon the said David was by me fined the sum of thirty shillings Current Money of Maryland which he paid down 5/-
