Whereupon it is Comanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should Take the said William Godes of the County of Somerset to Court of his Lordship held at Binsore Anno Domini the Third Day of June and Year of before the Justice thereof Come the said William Godes in his proper person According to a certain Proquirance by him and his Security in that part before Acknowledged and had hearing of the said Justice of the Peace that he Cometh and will not Cometh with his Lordship but for the saving of his Labor and Expenses about the Premises Submit himself at fine with his said Lordship and put himself upon the Court - Whereupon all and singular the premises being seen and by the Court fully understood it is Comanded by the Court here that the said William Godes for the Premises and Offences in the Information of above specified be taken which said William Godes present herein Cometh and is informed of the Premises and Offences of the sum of five Shillings and Money which he paid herein Cometh to the Sheriff for himself his Duty &

Command was Given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should Take the said Samuel Henry of Somerset County and Province of Maryland if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his Body before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Binsore Anno Domini the Third Tuesday of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and sixty One to answer unto Sampson Wheatly of Exeter that he Render him Eighteen pounds six Shillings and Nine pence and Sixpence Money of Maryland which to him he Owes and unjustly Detains and self and the said Days Given to the said Sampson here to

And hereupon the said Sampson Wheatly declared Against the said Samuel Henry in the Plea of in form following - Samuel Henry Late of Somerset County and Province of Maryland was Summoned to answer unto Sampson Wheatly of Exeter that he Render him Eighteen pounds six Shillings and Nine pence and Sixpence Money of the Province of Maryland which to him he Owes and unjustly Detains & And Whereupon the said Sampson by his Plea Demands his Attorney says that Whereas the said Samuel the Eighteenth Day of August Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and sixty at the County by his certain Writing Obligatory which the said Sampson Seals with the Seal of the said Samuel herein Cometh produces whose Date is the day and Year of said Acknowledge himself to be held and firmly bound unto the said Sampson in the sum of Eighteen pounds six Shillings and Nine pence and Money of the said Province to be paid unto the said Sampson when he the said Samuel should be there to afterwards Required Nevertheless the said Samuel altho after Required the said sum of Money to the said Sampson he hath not Paid but the same to him to Render hath denyed and still doth deny and unjustly Detain to the Damage of the said Sampson Twenty Pound and Money and thereof he brings Suit &

A Copy of the foregoing Declaration was made and sent to be served on the said Samuel Henry by all which day here Cometh the said Sampson Wheatly by his Attorney of the said Sheriff John Dennis Cometh here Returned that he had taken the said Samuel Henry whose Body here at this day he had Ready to answer the said Sampson Wheatly of the said Plea to him it was Comanded and for the same the said Sheriff Returned that he had served the said Samuel Henry with a Copy of the foregoing Declaration According to Act of Parliament in that
