Whereupon came hereinto Court the Petitioners in his Proper Person and had a hearing of the Petition aforesaid
and heard and fully understood it is Considered by the Court here that a Commission be sent to the Pet. William Robt.
as by the Petition Pet. is said and that Joseph Bell, George Finch, W. McHenry and John McHenry Commissioners
and execute the same Commission according to Act of Assembly in such Case provided by
