recitation and examination of the said seminary, and the CHAP. 127. students and scholars therein, as shall best promote the important objects of the Institution; Provided always, that per the said ordinances be not repugnant to the constitution

and laws of this State. Sec. 5. And be it enacted. That the said trustees, or a majority of them, shall meet at least twice in every year, in stated semi-annual meetings, to be appointed by their own ordinances, and at such other times as by their said ordinances, or by their own adjournments, they may direct, and when so assembled, they shall have power, from time to time, to appoint a President, Treasurer and Secretary, to make contracts with the professors or teachers, relative to the instruction of the scholars, to be placed under their care; and for the payment of their salaries; to examine the progress of the students and scholars in their learning; to hear and determine on all complaints and appeals, and upon all matters touching the discipline and government of the said Academy, and the execution of their ordinances, and generally to manage the estate and concerns of the said seminary in such manner as they shall deem best for the advancement and advantage of the Institution.

CHAPTER 127

An act for the relief of Lucinda Rodgers, of Allegany county. Passed Mar. 5, 1833

· Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Divorce granted. Maryland, Thet Lucinda Rodgers, of Allegany county, be,

and she is hereby divorced from bed, board and mutual cohabitation with her husband, Arthur M. Rodgers.

Sec. 2. And beit enacted, That said Arthur M.Rodgers shall claims annulted. not, by virtue of his marriage with the said Lucinda Rodgers, be authorized to have or claim any right or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed, of the said Lucinda Rodgers, whether acquired in any manner whatever, after the passage of this act; nor shall Lucinda Rodgers be authorized to have or claim any right or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed, of the said Arthur M. Rodgers, whether acquired in any manner whatever, before or after the passage of this act.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the said Lucinda Rodg- reme soleers shall have and exercise all the rights, privileges and immunities, and be subject to all the legal responsibilities
