Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That the said Commission- choose President ers elected according to the provisions of this act, shall on the first meeting after said election, choose some one of the said Commissioners President of the board, whose duty it shall be to preside at the meetings of said commissioners, and preserve order, and give such directions as may be deemed necessary by the said commissioners, to carry into full effect the provisions of this act.

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That the commissioners Meeting of Com aforesaid, or a majority of them, may meet together from time to time, as often as occasion may require, upon the business of said town, and not less than once in every three months, and if during the year for which they may be elected, any of the said commissioners should die, resign, remove from said town, refuse to act, or be otherwise disqualified, an election to fill such vacancy shall be held, at which all persons qualified as is specified in the second section of this act, shall be entitled to vote.

Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That the said commission- Clerk and record. ers, or a majority of them, shall have power to appoint a Clerk, and assign his duties, and allow him such compensation for his services as they may think proper; and that all ordinances passed by said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall by their clerk be recorded in a book to be kept for that purpose by him, which shall be opened at all times for the inspection of any person interested, and copies of all ordinances shall be put up in the most public places of said town, that the same may be generally known.

Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That all fines and forfeitures under the ordinances of the said corporation, shall be recoverable before any Justice of the Peace, as small debts are now recoverable out of Court.

Sec. 9. And be it enacted, That the limits of the said Town is Town of East New Market, shall extend to the distance of one half of a mile from the tavern aforesaid, each way, and the property within said limits shall be subject to such taxes and charges as may be deemed necessary by said Property commissioners, or a majority of them, to support and maintain the expences which may be at any time interred in the improvement of said town.
