CHAPTER 170.

Passed Mar. 13,1833 An act to exempt certain persons from serving as Jurors.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this sairt, the justices of the Orphans' Courts of the several cour-

bes, be and they are hereby exempt from serving as jurors in all cases whatsoever.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted. That it shall not herestep be lawful for the energed shorter of this State or any

CHAPTER 171.

Passed Mar. 13, 1233

An act to make public the road therein mentioned.

Declared public

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the new road in Anne Arundel county, leading from the bridge lately built over Patapsco river by William Krebs, at the place called Comwell's Point, until it intersects the road leading to Annapolis, commonly called the lower ferry road, be and the same is hereby declared to be public forever hereafter, and shall be kept in repair as other county roads in said county.

CHAPTER 172.

PenedMan 13,1633 An act to prevent playing Long Bullets, in or near Creager's Town, in Frederick County.

Penalty for pl

Section 1. Be it macted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, any person or persons, who shall be found playing at long bullets in Greager's town, in Frederic county, or within half a mile off-said town, shall forfeit and pay a sum of money not exceeding five dollars, for every such offence, at the discretion off-the justice of the peace trying the same, the one-half to the informer, the other half to the collector of the county aforesaid, to be applied to the use and benefit
