CHAPTER 181.

A Supplement to an act for the benefit of the heirs of Mary Burkhal. Passed Mar. 12, 1833

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners who may divide the real estate of Mary Enson, deceased, into three parts, conformably to the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, shall subject to the said provisions, subdivide the part which they would allot to Eleanor Merryman, if she were yet alive, into two portions of equal value, and allot one of said portion to the children of Mary Burkhal, who are named in the act to which this is a supplement, and the other of said portions to Micajah Merryman, Jr.

CHAPTER 182.

A further supplement to an act, entitled, "an act to establish a Bank and incorporate a Company, under the name of The Cumberland Bank of Allegany." Passed Mar. 12, 1833

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and eleven, chapter two hundred and seven, entitled, "An act to establish a Bank and incorporate a Company, under the name of The Cumberland Bank of Allegany," and the act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed in June session, eighteen hundred and twelve, chapter two, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to establish a Bank and incorporate a Company, under the name of The Cumberland Bank of Allegany, shall be and they are hereby re-established, revived, and made in full force and operation in the same manner and effect, to all intents and purposes whatsoever, as if no law had been enacted for settling up and closing the concerns of said Bank.
