CHAPTER 206.

PauedMan.15,1533 A further supplement to an act to erect Baltimore Town, in Baltimore county, into a City, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof.

Preamble

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, by a resolution, approved the fourteenth day of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-three, have declared it to be expedient to obtain an amendment to the charter of the City, so that the Mayor may be immediately elected by the people without the intervention of Electors—Therefore,

Mayor to be elect

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mayland, That at all future elections for the Mayor of the City of Baltimore, said officer shall-be voted for immediately by the people, and not by electors as hitherto, any thing in any act to the contrary notwithstanding, and said election shall be conducted in the same manner as is provided for by the act to which this is a supplement, and the several acts which are supplementary thereto, so far as it is consistent with or applicable to an election, made in the manner herein provided.

Case of vacane

in the Mayorally, the President of the first Branch of the City Council, or in o President of the first Branch, or in his absence from the City, that the President of the second Branch shall immediately order a new election, giving at least twenty days notice of the same by advertisement in all the daily newspapers in said City; and the said President of the first Branch of the City Council shall be ex-officio Mayor until a new election.
