

CHAP. 214.

Oath prescribed.

Sec. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners, before they proceed to act, shall take an oath or affirmation before some justice of the peace, that they will, without favor, partiality, or prejudice, assess the damages sustained by the persons through whose lands the said road may pass.

Case of vacancy.

Sec. 5. *And be it enacted*, That if any of the above named commissioners shall resign or refuse to act, or a vacancy occur by death or removal, the levy court of said county shall fill such vacancy at their next meeting.

CHAPTER 213.

Passed Mar. 14, 1813

An act to authorise the sale of a lot of ground therein mentioned.

Sale of lot authorized:

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of the town of Charlestown, in Cecil county, be and they are hereby authorised, at their discretion, to sell a lot of ground in said town, known as the public pump lot, and marked on the plot of said town with the letter K., and lying in front of the house of one Joshua Bennett.

CHAPTER 214.

Passed Mar. 10, 1833

An act for increasing the width of a part of Light-street, in the city of Baltimore.

Mayor, &c authorized to widen.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall be, and they are hereby authorised to provide for opening and increasing the width of that part of Light-street, in the city of Baltimore, near its junction with Baltimore-street, so that the said part may be of an equal and uniform breadth with the rest of the said street north of Pratt-street, to such extent, and upon such terms consistent with the provisions of this act, as they may deem advisable and best calculated to render the said street convenient to the citizens, and improve its beauty and usefulness; *Provided always*, that before any property of any person or corporation, shall be destroyed, injured, removed,
