Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Asemsbly of CHAP. 229. mac, so as not to incommode any person or persons, who may have improved or legally inclosed property. Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners Contract for dear are authorised to provide by contract, to be made for that stage comme purpose, for the depositing of such commodities on the lots, streets and alleys aforesaid, that may be made during the recess of said commissioners; and that all money ac-

and have him, or them, before some justice of the peace as aforesaid, where judgment shall be given, as the nature of the case may require.
