

ceiving from the commissioners an account on oath of the said expenses, including an allowance of two dollars per day to the commissioners for their services, to levy the same in proportion before stated, on the assessable property of said counties, to be collected as other county charges now are.

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Compensation to commissioners.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the commissioners, or a majority of them, shall value and ascertain the damages that may be sustained by any person or persons, through whose land the said road may be made to pass, taking into consideration the advantages and disadvantages, if any, and the damages so ascertained shall be levied and assessed as other county charges in said counties are, and shall be paid by the county, wherein such damages may be sustained.

Ascertain damages.

How rated.

Sec. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners, before they proceed to act, shall take an oath or affirmation before some justice of the peace, that they will, without favor, partiality, or prejudice, assess the damages sustained by the persons through whose land the said road may pass.

CHAPTER 234.

*An act empowering the Frederick County Court, sitting as a Court of Equity, to decree and order the sale of certain real estate.*

Passed Mar. 14, 1833

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Frederick County Court, sitting as a Court of Equity, are hereby authorised and empowered to decree and order a sale of the real estate of John Saylor, late of said county, deceased, under the proceedings already filed in said court, in number twelve hundred and sixty-two, on the equity docket of Frederick county court; *Provided*, said court are satisfied it will be for the benefit and advantages of all the parties concerned; *And provided*, that the minors interested under the devise of said John Saylor, in the said real estate, be made parties defendant in the said cause on said equity docket.
