Resolution relative to certain accounts.

Passed Feb. 27. 1833

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to J. J. Hitchcock, or order, ninety-two dollars and eighty-eight cents; to Messrs. Nicklin and Johnson, or order, thirty-eight dollars and sixty-five cents; to Messrs. Cushing and Sons, or order, eleven dollars; and to Messrs. Coale and Littell, or order, three hundred and fifty-two dollars and eighty-four cents, respectively due to each of them for books furnished to the State Library.

Resolution authorizing the Governor and Council to cause to be delivered a copy of the Index to the Laws of Maryland, from eighteen hundred and twenty-six to eighteen hundred and thirty-one, to each Court, and to each Judge or Justice of said Court, and to each Member of the General Assembly, &c. in this State. Passed Jan'y. 10

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Governor and Council be, and they are hereby authorised and requested, to cause a copy of the Index to the Laws of Maryland, from the year eighteen hundred and twenty-six, to eighteen hundred and thirty-one, inclusive, to be delivered to each Court, and to each Judge or Justice of said Court, to each Member of the General Assembly, to each Member of the Council, and to each public Library, in this State, and that the remaining copies be deposited in the State Library.
