Sec. 2. . Ind be it further enacted, That the Commissioners for Baltimore county shall have full power and au- least. thority to release and finally discharge the said William C. Weatherby of and from all liability and obligation to pay any sum or sums of money, by reason of his having executed any bond or bonds as surety of the said Scharf, to the State of Maryland, for the use and behoof of the said Scharf, to the Justices of the Levy Court of Baltimore county, or to the said Commissioners, upon their being satisfied of his inability to pay the same.

CHAPTER 39.

An act to divorce Cassandra O'Brien, of the city of Balti- Passed Feb. 7, 1833 more, from her husband Hugh O'Brien.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Divorce granted. Maryland, That Cassandra O'Brien he, and she is hereby divorced from bed, board, and mutual co-habitation with

her husband, Hugh O'Brien.

Sec. 2. And he it enacted, That the said Cassandra O'- Right as Fem. Brien be, and she is hereby authorized and empowered to make any contract with any person or persons whatsoever, and to sue and be sued in her own name, and without joining her said husband in any such suit or suits, and have and exercise all the rights, privileges, and immunities, and be subject to all the legal responsibilities of a feme sole, in the same manner she would have been if she never had been married; Provided always, that this act shall not be construed to authorize the said Cassandra O'Brien, or Except Hugh O'Brien, to contract marriage while the said parties are both living.
