

66. An act to repeal an act, passed at December session 1827, chapter 83, and for other purposes.

67. An act authorising the moderator and commissioners of Hagerstown, to levy on the assessable property of the said town, a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned.

68. An act to alter and change the name of Samuel Raitt Creighton, of Dorchester county.

69. An act for the relief of Daniel Orrell and others, of Caroline county.

70. An act to lay out and open a road in Cecil county.

71. An act to authorise the governor and council to appoint one justice of the levy court for each election district in Frederick county.

72. A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named, and for other purposes.

73. A supplement to an act to provide for the distribution of that part of the school fund, which is appropriated to Baltimore county, passed at December session, 1828, chap. 185.

74. An act relating to the Stone Church House, commonly called The Manor Church, in Frederick county.

75. An act to divorce Sarah Gilmor, of the City of Baltimore, from her husband David S. Barnum.

76. An act to repeal part of an act, passed at December session, 1828, chapter 21.

77. An act to provide for the completion of the records in the office of the Register of Wills, of Prince Georges' County.

78. A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to allow Adam Robb, executor of Upton Beall, late clerk of Montgomery county, further time to complete certain records, passed at December session 1828, chapter 2.

79. An act for the benefit of the Bank of Westminster, in Frederick county.

80. An act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to reduce the width of a part of Holland street.

81. An act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to open and extend Silver street, in the City of Baltimore, easterly from Spring street, to Caroline street.

82. An act to incorporate the Baltimore Snuff Mill Company.
