153. An act for the relief of Edward W. Belt, former collector of Prince George's County.

154. An act to regulate the letting out, by the Levy Courts of Worcester and Somerset Counties, the ferry known

as Stevens' or Pollitt's Ferry.

155. A supplement to an act, entitled, an act declaring the power of the Governor in certain criminal cases, passed at November session, 1795, chapter \$2.

156. An act to authorize the inhabitants of the several Primary School Districts, in Queen Anne's County, to levy a tax on the property in said districts for the establish-

ment of Schools.

157. An act relating to certain tresspasses upon real estate.

158. An act to lay out and open a road in Frederick and Baltimore counties.

159. A supplement to an act, entitled, an act to compel the Register of Wills in the several counties therein mentioned, to keep each his office at the seat of Justice, in the county for which he shall be register, passed December session 1804, chapter 39, so far as relates to Harford County.

160. A further supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the distribution of a certain fund, for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, so far as relates to Harford County.

165. An act to confirm an act, entitled, an act to alter add repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the division of Frederick County, into twelve election districts, and for other purposes, passed at December session 1831, chapter 112.

166. An act empowering Peter Wood Craine, to complete the collections of Jesse C. Cook deceased, late sheriff

and collector of Charles county.
