Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the clerk of Harford county court, be, and he is hereby authorised and required to record the said deed of manumission from Elizabeth Smith, liberating Joseph Lisby from slavery, and when recorded, to be of the same validity to all intents and purposes, as if the same had been recorded within the time limited by law for recording such deeds.

CHAPTER 9.

Passed Jan. 17, 1833 *An act to incorporate the Savings' Institution of Dorchester County.*

Time extended

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the time for carrying into operation, the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Savings' Institution of Dorchester county, passed December session eighteen hundred and thirty one, chapter two hundred eighty six, be and the same is hereby extended until the twentieth day of December eighteen hundred and thirty three.

CHAPTER 10.

Passed Jan. 19, 1833 *An act to authorise Thomas Bruce, the present Sheriff of Prince George's county, to bond as sheriff of said county, at any time before the tenth day of February next, and to authorise the clerk of said county to receive and record said bond.*

Bond authorised.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Thomas Bruce, Esquire, the present sheriff of Prince Georges' county, be, and he is hereby authorised to bond as sheriff of said county at any time before the tenth day of February next; *Provided,* the said bond shall be approved and attested according to law.
