Ordered by the Court here at this Day that the Day and year last mentioned that the Sherif of Kent County take the aforesaid Andrew Macquyer into his custody & execute the punishment in the judgment aforesaid specified and afterwards to bring him into Court again of which precept the said Sherif to wit Fred. Harrison Gent High Sherif of Kent County make Return on the Day and year last said that he hath executed the judgment and also that he hath here the said Andrew Macquyer before the Court

Mr. Simon Wilmer and Mr. Thomas Kinggold two of the Justices of this Court Returns Recognizance Dated Septemb. 27. 1725 Against the said Andrew Macquyer for feloniously stealing two young Hogs to wit the said Andrews Appear & ordered that he Recognizance and his Surety Recognizance be Disch.

Andrew Macquyer of Kent County Planter the Day and year last mentioned before the said Simon Wilmer and Thomas Kinggold Acknowledged himself Indebted unto the Lord Prop. of this Province in the sum of twenty pounds Sterl to be payed &c. Conditionally that if he should not appear at this Court to Answer unto what should be objected against him on Suspicion of feloniously stealing two young Hogs and if that in the mean time he should not be of good behaviour and now at the Court the said Andrew appears and thereupon his Recognizance is Discharged

Arthur Foreman and Jeremias Covinton both of Kent County Planters at the same 27. Day of Septemb. Anno Domini 1725 before the said Simon Wilmer and Thomas Kinggold Acknowledged themselves Indebted unto the Lord Prop. of this Province in the sum of ten pounds Sterl each to be payed &c. Conditionally that if the said Andrew Macquyer should not appear at this Court to Answer unto what should be objected against him on Suspicion of feloniously stealing two young Hogs and if that in the mean time he should not be of good behaviour and now at this Court the said Andrew appears and thereupon ~~they~~ though Arthur Foreman and Jeremias Covinton are Discharged from their Recognizance and

Jeremias Covinton at the same time and before the said Simon Wilmer and Thomas Kinggold Entered into Recognizance in the sum of ten pounds Sterl to be payed &c. Conditionally that if he should not appear at this Court as a prosecutor against the said Andrew Macquyer on Suspicion
