Cause lately made and provided also it is Considered by the said Justices  
that the afo<sup>d</sup> Katharine pay the sum of Six hundred & seventy two  
pounds of Tobacco costs accruing on the promises to the Officers of this  
Court

Thomas Jones at last June Court having entered into Recognizance  
for the afo<sup>d</sup> Katharine Banks appearance to the next assizes at the then  
next August Court to answer to an Information found against her  
for concination with a Negro and good behaviour which Recognizance  
was continued from the said August Court until this Court And now  
at this Court the said Katharine appearing Ordered that the said Tho.  
Jones his Recognizance be discharged

Thomas Jones of Kent County M<sup>r</sup>. at last June Court as of  
henceforward himself in debtors of Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> of this Province  
of Maryland in the sum of one pound Sterl to be Levyed  
Conditionally that if the said Katharine Banks shall not make  
her personal appearance at the then next August Court to answer  
to an Information found against her for concination with a Negro  
and if that in the meantime she shal<sup>t</sup> not be of good Behaviour  
which Recog<sup>r</sup> was continued until the third Tuesday of Nov<sup>r</sup>  
then next following at which said third Tuesday of November being  
the first day of Month anno Domini thousand hundred and  
twenty six the said Katharine Banks having appeared the said Thomas  
Jones his Recog<sup>r</sup> is Discharged

Ordered by the Court that y<sup>r</sup> d<sup>r</sup> Katharine Banks give security for to deliver  
her unto y<sup>r</sup> County Court or into Custody after the Execution of her  
present Service

November 20<sup>r</sup> Peter Massey and Thomas Jones both of Kent County Planters and professed how  
in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted  
the sum of two thousand pounds of Tob<sup>r</sup> each to be made and Levyed  
of their Lands and Tenement for the use of Kent County Conditionally that if  
they shall not deliver the said Katharine Banks up into the Custody of  
the Sherif of Kent County (or up to the County Court) at the Execution of  
her present Service (she now being a servant to a certain Mr<sup>r</sup> who now is ill)
