Ordered by the Court here that the Slave of Kent County hooligan thousand  
 Nicholas in safe Custody until he shall satisfy the Officers in the Judgment  
 & Specified

To His Lordship Kent County, &c. The Jurors for the Right Hon.  
 the Lord Prop. of that now is for Kent County aforesaid

 of Saint Paul's parish in the County aforesaid spinner  
 the tenth Day of May anno Dom 1726 hundred twenty and six at the  
 Parish aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court did commit fornication  
 with a certain person to the Jurors aforesaid unknown and did permit the  
 same unknown Person then and there to have carnal knowledge of her body  
 and to beget her and there a Bastard Child on the body of her the same anno  
 to the high displeasure of Almighty God to the will Example of all others  
 in such case offending contrary to the peace of the said Lord Prop. of that now  
 is his good rule and Government and against the form of the Act of Assembly  
 in that case made and provided

On the back of the preceding Indictment was this Endorsement to Sir

And the said Anna in her proper person came and saith that she cannot  
 gainsay the Indictment aforesaid so as aforesaid against her brought nor but that she  
 is guilty of the premises above upon her imposed as by the aforesaid Indictment it  
 is alledged and therupon Submits to the Court  
 Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here this fifteenth Day of November  
 anno Dom 1726 hundred twenty and six that the aforesaid Anna Tennen  
 pay the sum of thirty shillings Current Money of the Province of Maryland  
 as a fine for her aforesaid crime of committing fornication in form aforesaid Confect  
 to be applied for the use of this County according to Act of Assembly the aforesaid  
 Also the sum of two hundred sixty pounds of Tobacco Costs adjuing on the  
 premises aforesaid to the Officers of this Court

Ordered by the Court here that the said Anna Tennen pay the sum of four  
 hundred pounds of Tobacco to Mary Tennen for the trouble and Disgrace  
 of her life in bringing her the said Anna to bed of the child in the said aforesaid  
 ordered
