Ordered by the Court here that the said Edward Harris enter into his recognizance with good security for his appearance at next Court to answer unto an Information found against him for ~~for~~ ^{Extortion} and good behav^r.
 And thereupon Edward Harris of Kent County Gentleman present here in Court in his proper person doth acknowledge himself indebted unto the Lord Proprietor of this Province of Maryland in the sum of thirty pounds Sterling money of Great Britain to be made and Levied of his goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements for the use of the said Lord Proprietor his heirs and Successors Conditionally that if he shall not make his personall appearance before the Justices of our next County Court to be hold at our Court house in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday of June next to answer unto an Information found against him for Extortion of Goods and if that in the mean time he shall not be of good behaviour wherewith the said Edward Harris doth acknowledge himself to be Content — also

Daniel Flinn and John Young both of Kent County Pleaders present here in Court in their proper persons do acknowledge themselves indebted unto the Right hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietor of this Province of Maryland in the sum of fifteen pounds Sterling money of great Britain Each to be made and Levied of their goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements for the use of the said Lord Proprietor his heirs and Successors Conditionally that if the said Edward Harris shall not make his personall appearance before the Justices of our next County Court to be hold at our Court house in the Town of Chester in the said County of Kent on the third Tuesday of June next ensuing to answer unto an Information found against him for Extortion of Goods and if that in the mean time he the said Edward shall not be of good behaviour wherewith the same Daniel Flinn & John Young are Content
